

Control of the classification

■ Article 3(2):

"The indication of classes given by the applicant shall be subject to control by the International Bureau, which shall exercise the said control in association with the Office of origin. In the event of disagreement between the said Office and the International Bureau, the opinion of the latter shall prevail."



Rule 9(4)(a)(xiii)

- ... the names of the goods and services ...
- grouped in the appropriate classes ...
-each group preceded by the number of the class ...
- ... presented in the order of the classes ...
- ... indicated in precise terms ...
- In preferably using the words appearing in the Alphabetical List



Grounds for irregularities

Rule 12:

"If the International Bureau considers that the requirements of Rule 9(4)(a)(xiii) are not complied with ..."

Rule 13:

"If the International Bureau considers that any of the goods and services is indicated in the international application by a term that is too vague for the purposes of classification or is incomprehensible or is linguistically incorrect ..."

The Classification Guidelines



Background

- Requested by the Working Group Roundtable in November 2015
- Draft presented in June, available for comments until December 2016
- New draft to be presented in June 2017
- Purpose
 - inform users of the practice
 - serve as a resource for users
 - increase predictability of examination outcome



Guidelines for products

- Products than can be classified in more than one class according to their:
 - purpose only (e.g. "sea water" in 5 -medicinal- and 30 -cooking-);
 - material only (e.g. "gift bags" in 16 -paper- and 22 -textile-);
 - function only (e.g. "mobiles" in 20 -decoration- and 28 -toys-);
 - mode of operation only (e.g. "door opener" in class 6 -nonelectric- or 7 -electric-); or
 - nature only (e.g. "berries" in class 29 -processed- and 31 -fresh-) are acceptable in any of those classes
- Products than can be classified in more than one class according to more than one of the five criteria above require further specification (e.g. doors in classes 6, 11, 12 19 and 20)



Guidelines for services

Accept indications of services provided they have sufficient meaning in the context of the given class (e.g. "booking of seats" in 39 (travel) or 41 (shows))



Acceptable and non-acceptable indications

Acceptable

- class headings and general indications therefrom
- namely, in particular, i.e.
- "installation services in relation to the goods mentioned above in class 11" (class 37)
- "custom manufacturing of goods for others" (class 40)
- "wholesale" and "retail sale" in class 35
- trademarks and geographical indications
- acronyms, when unequivocal

Non-acceptable

- general terms outside their natural class without further specification (e.g. clothing outside 25)
- such as, and the like, etc.
- "all goods (services) in class X"
- "vegetables other than those listed in class 31"
- "manufacturing of goods"
- "parts and fittings" or "parts and accessories" without further specification



The International
Trademark System

Recurring issues

- "Game software" and "game programs" fall under class 9, while all "electronic games apparatus" fall under class 28
- "Alcoholic beverages" fall under class 33, irrespective of the level of alcohol
- "Filters" are classified according to their purpose or function, while "filtering materials" according to the material
- "Valves" are classified according to their function or purpose; when that is not possible, according to their material
- "Services provided by an association to its members" are classified according to the nature of the service
- "Kits" are classified according to their purpose or by their composition, provided all goods comprised in the kit fall under the same class

Format

- Proper punctuation is recommended; however, the International Bureau will not amend the list by:
 - adding, removing or changing punctuation marks;
 - changing indications from singular to plural; or,
 - adding or removing brackets
- The International Bureau will format the list from upper case to lower case characters, keeping upper case for:
 - first word per class
 - acronyms



Madrid Goods and Services Manager



Madrid Goods and Services Manager

- Online tool to compile lists of goods and services according to the Nice Classification
- Available since December 2010
- Contains the alphabetical list of the Nice Classification; frequently used terms extracted from the International Register; and, terms from other databases (TM5, USPTO, etc.)
- Near 100 thousand terms in English
- Available in 18 languages
- Shows similar group codes used by JPO and KIPO
- Displays acceptance by 27 Offices



Functions

■ BROWSE per class to select goods and services from a "pick-list" of terms pre-accepted by WIPO



■ **SEARCH** acceptable terms using keywords



- CHECK ACCEPTANCE of terms:
 - by WIPO (free-text)
 - by a designated Contracting Party (dCP)






Features

- NICE indications are clearly identified Nu 20 pillows
- One-click limitation of results to NICE indications ☑NICE only
- Clear identification of all classes containing results 13 results in class(es)
- One-click restriction of results to a selected class
- No cumbersome paging to move through the results
- User list always visible
- Free-text terms can be typed with or without segmentation by semicolons
- One-click access to translation
- Print or translate lists in a format directly usable for filing




A three-layer data structure (1)





A three-layer data structure (2)






MGS – Display of Acceptance / Rejection





Display Acceptance or Rejection







Basic List:

 apparatus for recording, transmission or reproduction of sound or images;
 cameras including video cameras and digital cameras;
 magnetic data carriers, recording disks;
 recording media;
 computer disks, audio tapes, ver tapes, disks, cassettes, cds including computer eds and memory sticks;
 calculators:

 cables;
 electronic and electrical products in this class;
 televisions, televideos, televideos, digital set top boxes, overhead projectors, stereos, videos including video players and video recorders, radios including clock radios, dvd
